If you have any questions on the Association or if I can assist you, please feel free to call me.





Dear Mg. Raim:

I would like to thank you for sponsoring the community leader meeting and for inviting me to address you on a topic of extreme importance. In our democratic system, decision-making bodies, namely public and private boards and commissions, identify priorities, create policies, and provide funds and services in an effort to solve problems for the community at large. The Hispanic community in Santa Clara County faces a serious problem of underrepresentation on these decision-making bodies. Hispanics comprise over 25% of the county's population, yet only 7% of those on boards and commissions in the county are Hispanic. Only 6% of those on boards and commissions in San Jose are Hispanic, though Hispanics represent 45% of the city's population.

MALDEF's Santa Clara County Leadership Development Program seeks to alleviate this problem by assisting mid-career Hispanic professionals in the development of leadership skills to help them obtain positions on local private and public boards and commissions. The program consists of an intensive 20-week series of evening seminars, each focusing on a different skill such as time management, media relations, fundraising, etc. A visit to the State Capitol for a first-hand experience of the legislative process is included in each 20-week cycle. The program also provides placement assistance on boards and commissions for its graduates.

The success of the program depends on media visibility and access to the community grapevine in attracting prospective applicants and funders. My goal is to share with you information which will spark your interest and enthusiasm about the program and motivate you to assist us. Enclosed are two public service announcements which I hope you will broadcast on your station. I want to thank Mr. Leonard C. Ramirez, Executive Director of the Santa Clara County Broadcasters Association, for extending this invitation, and thank you for your cooperation.

Each week our audience call in participation is very strong with all the phone lines going. We average up to 35 calls per two hour show. Subject matter being very important. I usually schedule three guests per show which keeps the interest rate high and the pace moving. Helpful publicity from Metro and interesting guests have helped greatly.
